What an affidavit is:

An affidavit does not stand alone. In other words, once you sign an affidavit, you're not "off the hook." An affidavit means that if you are called to testify, this is what you are going to say (under oath and subject to being charged with perjury if something in the affidavit is not true.)

An affidavit is only about you. It is only about what you actually saw, what you actually heard, what you actually did, or what you saw someone else do.

An affidavit is factually important.

You may not speculate in an affidavit or make conclusions.

Have you ever watched a television show with a trial? If so, envision that you are on the witness stand and you're being questioned about what you wrote in an affidavit. Let's say you wrote, "On Monday, January 9, 2024, I was standing at the corner of _______" So now you're on the witness stand and the attorney says to you, "All of this is true?" (You respond "yes") Then the attorney says, "Would it surprise you know that January 9, 2024 was not a Monday, but a Tuesday?" BINGO – right then and there your credibility is questioned. No matter what else you wrote, there is a question in people's minds.

Our court system is backed up with too many cases. Affidavits that are poorly written, that are not well-thought-out become the basis for cases that are dismissed.

If you're going to sign your name to an affidavit, you had best read it over and over and make sure every bit of it is factual, based upon what you actually saw/did/heard – no guessing, no speculation, no innuendo.

On a positive note, a well drafted affidavit can move a case along. It can help with settlement efforts.

At Michigan Fair Elections we are working to make sure that all affidavits presented by anyone who witnesses anything regarding elections will be (to quote Mary Poppins) "practically perfect."

Please know: this is not a "paper exercise." An affidavit is a legal document.

FOR THOSE OF YOU WHO LIKE SPORTS, PLEASE READ THIS:

Every time I attend a sports game – whether it's football, basketball, soccer or whatever, I become impatient with all of the flags, whistles, etc. I just want to say, "Look, he took the ball. Let's move along." Friends with me talk about the important of the rules, the regulations, and how "it" wouldn't work without them.

THE SAME IS TRUE WITH LAW. Please just see an affidavit as one of the rules that everyone knows at these sporting events, something everyone lives with. An affidavit is part of the rule of law, and this is how we must write them in order to enter the arena of life called the legal system.

A well-drafted affidavit should leave the reader with only one SPECIFIC conclusion such as:
"Bill Jones does not live at 429 Brookside Drive,
St. Louis, Michigan yet he is registered to vote from that address." (You do your job is preparing the affidavit and leave the rest of the work to a clerk or an attorney.)

<u>SAMPLE AFFIDAVIT #1 —</u> The PURPOSE of this affidavit is to give the clerk the information. The individual CAN leave the original affidavit with the clerk, but keep a copy. But the clerk must see the Affidavit.

To be prepared by someone who canvasses for Soles to the Rolls (or a similar organization). The **required content** of an affidavit is:

- name of the individual completing the affidavit (and where the individual lives generally: "Clinton County, Michigan")
- •the address where the data was collected. Address would be street number, city and/or township (make sure the name of the city or the township is the same as that listed on the QVF)
 - •the date the information was collected
- •either the name of the individual who provided you with the information OR a statement that the person did not choose to give you a name OR the fact that you personally witnessed something about the property (i.e. it's a vacant lot!)
 - •your signature but signed in the presence of a notary!

SAMPLE AFFIDAVIT #4: The PURPOSE of this affidavit is to keep it for a legal proceeding. The undersigned should tell the notary that it might be going out of state so that the notary places his/her seal on the document. The original of this should stay with Michigan Fair Elections. To be prepared by someone who works as an election inspector, a poll challenger, or a poll watcher. Document as much as possible; take pictures when and if possible. Also, if you see someone accusing a poll challenger of "intimidating them," PLEASE write an affidavit with what **you** witnessed.

Primary tabs

An affidavit is a <u>sworn statement</u> a person makes before a <u>notary</u> or <u>officer of the court</u> outside of the <u>court</u> asserting that certain <u>facts</u> are true to the best of that person's knowledge. Affidavits by both <u>plaintiff/prosecution</u> and <u>defense witnesses</u> are usually collected in preparation for a <u>trial</u>.

In the event a witness's <u>testimony</u> contradicts what they stated in their affidavit, the affidavit can be introduced as <u>evidence</u> to <u>impeach</u> that witness in accordance with <u>Federal Rule of Evidence 607</u>. An impeachment of this sort can potentially lead to <u>criminal</u> charges of <u>perjury</u> if the contradiction was made <u>knowingly</u>, intentionally, and involved a material issue.

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
